Conventional - Conventional types generally like to work with papers and numbers. They tend to have clerical and math abilities, and like to work indoors and organize things. They enjoy following orderly routines, meeting clear standards, and avoiding work that does not have clear directions. Those that excel are described as being conscientious, careful, efficient, inhibited, obedient, orderly, persistent, practical, thrifty, conforming, and unimaginative. They prefer structured business situations involving data analysis, finance, planning and organizational tasks. They value efficiency and order.
